STRANGERS IN THEIR OWN LAND 11.30am

Banned in Australia, after RTZ (CRA) sued Australian Broadcasting (GRANADA TV '78)

Premiere

WORKSHOPS

URAN- IUM CARTEL

RTZ sat as "an equal among nations" on a uranium cartel which operated from 1971 to control the world market. MIKE MARTEN of The Beast magazine, who has researched the cartel for several years, will present 300-odd documents incriminating RTZ, which were "lifted" from Mary Kathleen U.Co.



AUST'ASIA

In Australasia, RTZ is a giant among giants. Through CRA it has claimed 22% of Victoria alone. LES RUSSELL of the Aboriginal Mining Info. Centre (himself an Aborigine) takes a workshop. The COMALCO secret documents will also be available.

LABRADOR

For 3 years, Labrador Inuit (eskimo) fought Brinco's plans - as a subsidiary of RTZ to open a uranium mine. RANDY SWEETNAM of the Labrador Inuit Assoc. describes how the plan was halted.

PANAMA

Cerro Colorado may become the world's biggest copper mine. It's in the middle of Guaymi 'Indian' land. GORDON BENNETT, recently in Panama, is an international lawyer. He presents a critique of the project with MARTIN HONEYWELL of LAB.

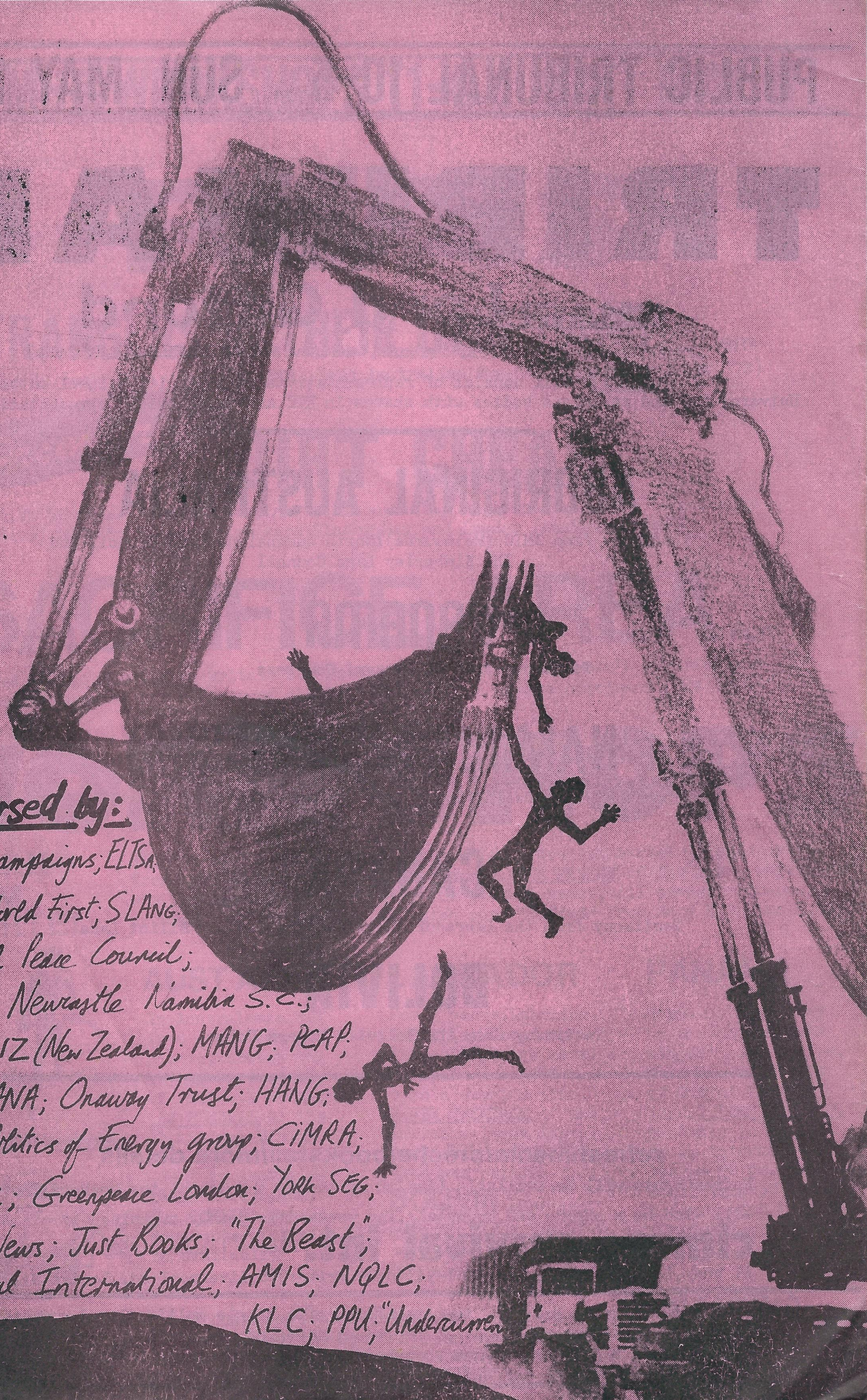
